

“Section 106/National Register Eligibility Training”

Description:

This training is an overview of the implementing regulations of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, (36 CFR Part 800). This is a one-day course overview based on modules developed by the Ohio Historic Preservation Office, presented with an ODOT perspective.

Also included is an overview of the four National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility criteria, including the seven aspects of integrity, as issued by the Keeper of the National Register. It also includes a discussion of boundary determinations, what is considered and not considered when defining boundaries for National Register eligible properties.

All consultants who are involved with cultural resources investigations; including, not not limited to:

Prequalification:

This class is a prequalification requirement for ODOT and is a *pre-requisite* to the upcoming “ODOT Cultural Resources Handbook Training”, also a prequalification requirement, planned to begin in early 2004.

NOTE: All project managers, principal investigators, field supervisors and field directors in consulting firms already prequalified in Archaeological Investigations and History/Architectural Investigations must take both of the above offered ODOT training classes to be prequalified to perform work for the Department.

To receive credit for taking this class, all attendees should successfully pass a test to be given at the end of the class. Anyone not passing the test, will need to re-take the class.
